

This map shows the location of rocks (and fossils) from various geological eras. To the northeast are the Paleozoic (meaning ancient in Greek) rocks and the remnants of the once 20,000-foot-high Appalachian Mountains. To the southwest are the Mesozoic and Cenozoic (meaning middle and recent) rocks that delineate the Gulf of Mexico's retreating coast. In the middle of the state, rock deposits, shown in green, trace the Black Belt.
